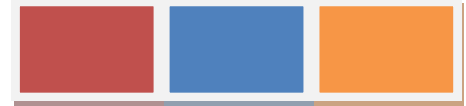

## TEEN Group



The Relatives As Parents Program (RAPP) sponsored Teen Group is a fun learning experience where teens can be themselves, see their potential and make an impact on their community.



The Teen Group is for kinship and foster care teens ages 12 years old and older. The Teen Group will provide an opportunity for teens to express themselves peer-to-peer in a supportive environment. The purpose of the group is to build self-esteem and to give each teen a sense of accomplishment by working together on community service projects. The Teen Group will show teens that although they cannot control their circumstances, they can work together to accomplish whatever they set their minds to. They will learn the importance of each teen doing their part on a team and the impact they can make on the community.

There is no **I** in **TEAMWORK**

Teens will meet twice each month. One meeting will be held on a weekday for a peer support group and the second meeting will be on a Saturday for a group community service project.
